Preparing for a Spring Event and Embracing the Uncomfortable By Chelsea Bassett

I've never found church particularly comfortable, which admittedly is often a good thing. I'm only newly comfortable with practicing Christianity. I regularly worry that I'm doing everything wrong. The Creed feels funny in my mouth, though the Lord's Prayer always feels like holding hands with my grandmother. And the practice of a woman's group baffled me for years. Couldn't I just sit with the men and drink coffee, instead?

But as you probably know, all women of the ELCA are *Women of the ELCA*, and gradually, I got to know the women of our church through our regular meetings. Seeing the ways they care for our community and how they repeatedly seek new ways to practice compassion, I accepted their invitations to participate more regularly. Each time I was invited to a new meeting or a new conversation, I learned to embrace my discomfort and trust that I would learn new things about myself, our community, and our globe.

The Women of the ELCA don't shy away from uncomfortable topics. They challenge the status quo and question how we can do more and better things together. SWO Board Meeting October 31, 2023 via Zoom

Welcome by Deb Martin

Devotion by Phyllis-Courage for the Chicken Hearted. Prayer-Monsters of Today.

Call to order at 7:20 p.m.

Phyllis read our purpose statement.

Agenda presented by Deb and corrections addressed:

Lutheran Disaster Relief to Lutheran Disaster Response. LDR. Motion made by M Phyllis/Shirley. All approved.

Treasurer's report from Biennial by Carol

- Note reference of abbreviation "RUO" by Phyllis. Regular Units Offered.
- Discussion on line items.
- O Pennies for Katie's Fund- drop the Pennies.
- O Katie's Funds dollar amount is \$400+ so Carol will send now to churchwide.
- O Funds coming in from church groups are an In and Out to churchwide.

Biennial Offering - 40% went to LDR and 60% went to Women of ELCA.

Report not finalized for **October,** missing some funding not sent in by other ladies groups etc. Once completed Carol will update this report for finalization and approval. SWO current October ending balance of \$1410.

September report. Ending balance - \$10,204.38. M Lois/ Pam. All approved.

Winter retreat at Pine Lake for new board. Lynn will make arrangements and finalize with Robyn at Pine Lake. Will get additional information from Lois.

Racial Justice Conference in 2025- Shirley is coordinating. Lynn will work with her on this. Event dates are April 5 (first choice) or April 12, 2025 (second choice) at Ascension Green Bay. \$2500 seed money was approved at the convention. Motion Carol/ Pam to move forward with this preliminary plan. Approved.

Deb Martin suggested New Members look through the shared drive folder to get familiar with events, dates and planning ideas. Deb will organize folders on the shared drive.

SWO Board Meeting Minutes—continued

President's Report:

LIRS Christmas Cards. (Lutheran Immigration Refugee Service) Deb encouraged members to go to the website and click on Hope for the Holidays. Christmas cards can be sent in a large envelope for those in detention centers. https://www.lirs.org/ Triennial - Shirley and Deb were the voting delegates. At the next biennial people will be elected to be voting members at the next Triennial Convention. The number of voting delegates we are allowed depends on how many active units we have in the synod. Alternates will also be needed.

Deb recommended the book My Body is Not a Prayer Request by Amy Kenny She spoke of using correct terminology such as a person with a disability or a person with mobility issues.

Old Business:

Discussion of Biennial Convention: Registration worked well with Jeanne Jerks taking care of the online registration. Flyers were posted in The Wave, Open Door. Links for the registration did not work in the Open Door. A better system is needed for providing the board with speaker's names and phone numbers which should be printed out. Technology did not always work. Carol will follow up with money to be paid to Rev. Cindy Crane for speaking and mileage reimbursement. Suggestions for people registering on time for planning for food: Offer no refunds, early bird discount for next time, work with a caterer for an initial number of people at first date and have an extension for a second date. The registration fee was \$35.00. A Thrivent grant of \$250 was used toward the food. Biebels charged \$16.75 per person. The food was delicious. Carol will send a thank you to the caterer. Next time write a Thrivent grant for the speakers. The in-kind gift offering had an excellent response. Two carloads of baby items were distributed to the Stockbridge-Munsee Tribe. Breakfast was provided by St. Mark's in Neenah which was excellent. For the next Biennial, St. John, DePere will be doing the breakfast. Sharon Doll assisted the ladies in making the tie blankets. Lois will write a thank you to Sharon. Eleven tie blankets went to the Stockbridge-Munsee Reservation. Two went to Oshkosh to be made and distributed. As soon as we know the date for the next Biennial Convention, the Churchwide Office of the WELCA will need to be informed in order to send a representative. They will pay for airfare. We will pay for lodging and food. St Mark's in Neenah will host the next Biennial. The president of SWO is a voting member of the Synod Council. Deb and Lois will meet to prepare a convention report to the WELCA Churchwide.

Motion made by Shirley and seconded by Kimberly to have the SWO Retreat, Feb 2-3 at Crossways, Pine Lake Arrival at 3:00 PM Tasks to be accomplished include Set 2024 Calendar, Make assignments for Open Door articles, Figure out Shared Drive - Chelsea volunteered to do this. Chelsea will also put together the new board with pictures for the Open Door. She will contact Jeannie Jerks with this information for the synod website WELCA page. Chelsea will support our Facebook page. Lynn and Shirley will set an agenda for the retreat. Carol will send money to Pine Lake for the seven attendees.

New members assignment: By November 20th write an article about who you are and why you are involved in WELCA. Email it to Shirley

Fall Retreat 2024 M Lola / Carol to have Gaye Lindfors as a speaker for \$1500 plus two nights lodging. Amended M Phyllis / Deb that Gaye Lindfors be the speaker for \$1500 including mileage and lodging. Motion passed as amended. Carol will investigate the charges at Imago Dei, as there may be a base fee for Johnson Lodge. Gaye may need to stay at a hotel the night of the retreat. The Silent Auction will be held for scholarships.
